MSG (Ret) Charles Oliver Walker, JR was born May 24, 1940 in Columbus, GA, to Charles Oliver Walker, SR and Minnie Shipp Walker. He was married to Faustina Coleman Walker.

Charles departed this life August 19, 2012 in the James A. Haley Veteran's Hospital, Tampa, FL, after a chronic illness. He was predeceased by his parents and brother, Clifton Shipp. He is survived by his wife Faustina, his children, Jacqueline R. Walker, Gwendolyn C. Walker, Charles O. Walker, III (Claudia), and Lisa E. Walker; four grandchildren, Meagan and Heather Chesley and Charles IV and Carmen Walker; numerous cousins, nephews, nieces, other relatives, a host of friends and loved ones.

He professed his faith and was baptized in 1952 at First Baptist Church, Columbus, GA.

Charles graduated from Spencer Senior High in June 1959. He studied at Albany State College, Albany, Georgia, for one year. He later earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Business Administration from Fayetteville State University, Fayetteville, NC, in 1985.

He enlisted in the Army in 1960 and served for twenty one years. During that time he served tours of duty at Fort Leonard Wood, MO, Fort Campbell, KY, Fort Benning, GA, Augsburg, Germany, two tours of duty in Viet Nam, and Fort Bragg, NC where he retired in 1981. Charles was awarded the Soldier's Medal; Purple Heart; Bronze Star Medal with V Device and two Oak Leaf Clusters; Ranger Tab, Army Commendation Medal with V Device and One Oak Leaf Cluster; Meritorious Service Medal; Air Medal; Good Conduct Medal (7<sup>th</sup> Award); Drill Sergeant Identification Badge; Army Service Ribbon; National Defense Service Medal; Combat Infantrymen Badge; Master Parachutist Badge; Meritorious Unit Commendation; NCO Professional Development Ribbon (3); Oversea Service Ribbon (1); Vietnam Service Medal; Vietnam Campaign Medal; Vietnam Cross of Gallantry with Palm and a Vietnam Civil Actions Unit Citation. Charles was a "Barrel Chested Freedom Fighter".

After his retirement he was employed by Triple P Services, Goldsboro, NC, as a grant and proposal writer.

He will be remembered fondly by many as Coach Walker and his devotion to Pop Warner sports, as well as for his love for fishing.

Charles was a lifetime member of Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity and a member of American Legion Post 167, Tampa, FL.
